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
Dear Dr. Racher:

Thank you for your letter of January 31, 2019 regarding historical employment and contracting statistics.

The statistics that were quoted in the Northern New Services article were obtained from the Giant Mine Remediation Project's (GMRP) presentation to Yellowknife City Council on January 21, 2019. I have attached a copy of the quoted statistics for ease of reference (please see Annex A).

It is important to note that the quoted statistics are a roll up of annual data and cover a period of 11 years (2006-2017) for contracting and a period of 8 years (2009-2017) for employment data. The data reported in the GMRP Annual Reports is for that reporting year only. Therefore, these numbers cannot be directly compared.

There is some overlap between Southern, Northern, Indigenous and AOC terminology. The diagram included provides a visual to distinguish between the different terms and can be used to help explain the differences with stakeholders and other audiences.

Aboriginal Opportunity Considerations (AOCs) are measures aimed at maximizing opportunities for Aboriginal communities, businesses and individuals. The intent of the AOC is to maximize participation from the local and regional Indigenous population within the area of the contract. The AOC is a subset of both Northern and Indigenous, in which Indigenous could be either Northern or Southern, and where Northern is defined as being located north of 60° latitude. As a result, there is an overlap between the reporting categories.

I have attached a table (Annex B) showing GMRP contracts from 2006 to 2017 and you will see that the total value of all contracts is \$356M with \$169M going to Indigenous businesses. This report includes data on contracts put in place by PSPC and was compiled using actual contract data, which is also reported on www.buyandsell.gc.ca. The Aboriginal status of each company was verified using the Industry Canada Indigenous Business Directory. It does not include costs outside of PSPC contracts, such as learning events put on for the GMRP team, travel in support of the GMRP, or other operational costs. It also does not include any contracts put in place by CIRNAC or other departments in support of the Giant Mine Remediation Project. It also does not include capital acquisitions by the Federal Government; this amount is \$72,334, and is related to the purchase of vehicles equipped for driving on the mine site.

The tracking of employment data has evolved over the course of the project, as new areas of interest have been identified over time. I have attached a table of employment data ranging from January 2007 to March 2017 (Annex C). As you will see, there are gaps in data collection going from January 2007 to March of 2013. Please refer to the end of Annex C table for specifics on the gaps. The format GMRP currently uses has been in place, mostly unchanged, since 2015. Since April of 2015, the GMRP has been collecting employment data on all contractors, consultants, subcontractors and PSPC staff. I do note that there is a gap in tracking CIRNAC and GNWT staff. We also do not currently include employment statistics for contributions the Project makes to affected parties and stakeholders, such as YKDFN, AN, NSMA, City of Yellowknife and GMOB.

I look forward to continuing to work with GMOB to improve our reporting and am open to suggestions going forward.



Specific gaps identified in the employment data ranging from 2007 – 2017:

- (1) person hours for all employees was not tracked until 2013-14;
- (2) though tracking of AOC was introduced in 2013-14, it wasn't until 2015-16 that the AOC data was accurately collected;
- (3) missing March 2013 data; and
- (4) up until 2015-16, the totals for persons employed were the maximum number of employees in a given quarter and fiscal year instead of individual persons employed.
